

Aims - the Peep TALK Training equips practitioners to:

- expand your knowledge, skills and understanding in supporting parents with their young child's communication and language development, including those who are concerned about delayed language development
- use the Peep TALK programme as a flexible toolkit, offering parents strategies and activities to boost their children's language and communication during everyday interactions in the home learning environment
- deliver Peep TALK sessions with parents and children together, in one-to-one or group sessions.

The Peep TALK Programme:

- is to use with parents and their young children to help parents support their children's speech, language, and communication development
- is for children with an age or developmental stage from about 18 months to four years
- contains eight group or 1:1 sessions, along with 'Talking at Home' handouts, tips and video clips for you to share with parents and their children (included with the Training)
- helps parents understand what they can do and how it benefits their child's speech and language development





- is suitable for a first in-house intervention or for families whose children are on a waiting list to see a Speech and Language Therapist
- provides an interactive, strengths-based and non-judgemental way of working with families
- focuses on simple, free or low-cost activities and everyday interactions that support communication and language development in the home learning environment
- aligns with our other Peep programmes
- was developed by Peeple in collaboration with Speech and Language Therapists

Peep TALK Training (1-day):

- **During the training:** You will explore practical delivery ideas, strategies and resources, using the Peep TALK Programme. The training values and builds on your knowledge, skills and experience.
- Who should attend the training: Peep TALK is aimed at any practitioners working with parents of young children, particularly parents who are concerned about their child's developing speech, language and communication. This could, for example, include staff in family hubs or centres, children's centres, community centres, or education and childcare settings.
- How the training is delivered: Face-to-face or live online. If online, we will post you a delegate pack beforehand.
- **Post-course delivery support:** On-going online access to Peep TALK resources and delivery support guidance.
