



1. **Washing toys** - cars, dolls, anything that can get wet! Maybe make up a story together about the toy's adventures that led to the Big Wash.



2. **Digging in the mud** - with a stick, small spade or old spoon, in the garden or in a corner of the local park or rec. Fun to listen in - is your child more interested in looking for insects, digging a hole or making up a story...?



3. **Exploring a summer hedge** - (magnifying glass optional!) All sorts of shapes, sizes and patterns on the summer leaves, can they spot any differences? Chat about who might live in the hedge. Pick up a few leaves and sticks to make a picture, or a house for an elf or small toy.



4. **Summer sights and sounds** - can you hear or see any birds, planes, butterflies, buzzing bees? Can you spot any swifts high in the sky, with their forked tails, that fly here for summer all the way from central Africa, sleeping on the wing as they fly?! Look on a map together in the library or on google maps to see how far that is!



Children will be learning lots as they're playing and talking to you about what they're doing!



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
